

How a First Nation accesses the *First Nations Fiscal Management Act (FMA)*:

In order to opt into the property taxation and borrowing provisions of the *FMA*, the Chief and Council of an interested First Nation must provide a resolution of Council, to the attention of the Minister of Indigenous and Northern Affairs requesting to be placed on the Schedule.
